

Using the Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps

The Sanborn maps are available online through the University Libraries (you will need to sign in with your x500 username and password): <http://www.lib.umn.edu/get/12356>

- Click “Browse Maps”
- Select “Minnesota” from the drop down menu
- Select your city (Minneapolis, e.g.)
- Select a date or date range (1912-1930, e.g.)
- Some cities are displayed in multiple volumes for the date range you selected (check for multiple volumes using the “Select a Volume” drop down menu at the top-right of the screen)
 - Each volume should have a Key Sheet – this is your index to the other sheets
 - Find the volume that has a Key Sheet that shows the area of interest
 - Click the sheet to view it → zoom in to your area → the large black numbers indicate the sheet number for the detailed view of your area

Tips & Tricks

- When viewing a particular sheet, click “Download Map” at the top of the window to download the sheet as a PDF file for easier viewing
